FROM THE PRINCIPAL

2024 Intakes:

Can you please let us know asap if your child/ren won't be returning next year and therefore will not require a place in R-6 in 2024 at BPS. This information enables us to determine the number of classes and staffing requirements for next year. Could you please let classroom teachers or the front office staff know by the end of week 1 next term.

Please note from next year there will be 2 intakes for children entering reception: term 1 intake and a term 3 intake. Children who start preschool in term 1 will start reception in term 1 of the following year and complete 4 terms of reception. Children who start preschool in term 3 will start reception in term 3 of the following year and complete 6 terms of reception.



Class Placements:

Next term our staff will spend quite a bit of time looking at class structures and class placements of students for 2024. This is a lengthy process that involves a number of considerations, including considering individual student needs and asking all students to think about friendships and who they would like to be placed in a class with.

Please address emails to myself by the end of week 3 next term, Friday 3rd Nov.

Please be advised that requesting specific teachers and asking that your child NOT be placed with certain students, would be considered only for educational reasons.

Due to the complexity of the class placement process, changes cannot be made (once finalised) except under exceptional circumstances.



FROM THE PRINCIPAL

Gates:

Just a reminder that we are attempting to keep gates closed and locked during the day school day from 8:50am to 3pm.

Reasons for this are firstly for safety and security. We have been working hard on updating our work health and safety procedures and processes (WHS). It is imperative we know who is on our site at all times, particularly in the case of emergency procedures such as in-vacuations (shelter in place) or evacuations. We do this by signing all visitors in via the front office.

Secondly, families being on-site quite early, can cause disruption and distraction to our students' learning.

With gates open early we do find other members of the public using our site as a walk through and/or accessing school play equipment etc. Again, the supervision and safety of our students and staff is our upmost priority.

We are aware that this may cause inconvenience to some, and that parking in particular at this site is an issue, however the safety, well-being and uninterrupted learning of our students is paramount.

In the long term we would ideally like to have the whole school adequately fenced and gated and this will be a discussion with Governing Council going forward.

Questions, Complaints or Enquiries:

We are currently developing a simple process for when families wish to make a general enquiry or a complaint or just ask a question.

At times our front office staff can answer these questions straight away. Sometimes parents may want to speak to a member of the leadership team.

We attempt to ring back asap, however this may not happen on the same day as your enquiry as our leadership team and myself are often in classrooms, on duty or in meetings.

We hope to finalise this by the start of next term and will keep you updated.

Student behaviours:

Just a reminder that when and if your child receives a consequence for behaviour – It is part of school policy in that SA schools we are unable to tell other families what this consequence was and vice versa. We can only tell you the consequence for your own child's behaviour.

Please be assured our Leaders and Well -being team make considered decisions and follow site based processes in all cases.

A consequence for behaviour could range from missing some play time, to performing some community service on site or even be a take home or suspension from school.

Usually restorative conversations take place if one or more students have had an altercation. After incidents, students may have support plans developed and implemented to ensure they are able to successfully return to their learning

SCIENCE WEEK

On Wednesday, the Amazing Nitro Nat visited our school to share with us the wonders of chemistry! There were 3 sessions across the day, with each class having the opportunity to attend.

We saw how chemicals can change colour based on the bases or acidity of the chemical. We watched how some chemicals can change colour through movement and return to 'colourless' once still.

We learnt many things about oxygen and how particles need oxygen to sometimes cause a chemical reaction and how fire



needs oxygen to be fire. This was demonstrated through a gummy bear experiment and blowing air through a funnel to create fire.

Students who attended were in awe of how chemicals changed colours and particularly liked the fire experiments.

The show ended with an experiment called elephants toothpaste, where through a chemical reaction foam exploded out of the beaker up towards the ceiling!

In science lessons this week, students are learning about space rovers: the technology behind them and what scientific research they conduct on different planets.

Receptions are participating in a colouring in competition relating to rovers, whilst other year levels are being challenged to name the next Lunar Rover that is heading to the Moon in 2026. Winners will be announced in term 4.

On Saturday 23rd September 9 of our students performed on stage at the Adelaide Festival Theatre as part of the Public Primary Schools Festival of Music.

The Primary Schools Festival of Music, an official state icon, and custodian of an iconic South Australian tradition, engages our students in artistic excellence, cultural diversity and social inclusion through performance in Music and the Arts.

This year we commissioned Paul Jarman to compose a set of four songs entitled "World of Tomorrow".
