Dear Families,



What's been happening in Room 2?

What a busy start of the year its been! In Room 2 we have started our literacy learning journey using Heggerty and InitiaLit (whole class literacy programs incorporating phonological awareness, literature and vocabulary). We have developed our understanding of rhyming, syllables, letter recognition, initial sounds, blending and letter formation.

Our weekly library visits with our own decorated library bags have also been a highlight of our first few weeks of school. We have also enjoyed reading storybooks, developing our vocabulary and producing some fantastic artwork to support our understanding of these stories.

In Maths we have looked at a variety of concepts including sorting, patterning and number value. We have set a variety of goals for the term in literacy and numeracy and are working hard to develop our skills in all areas.

We are now experts at following the structures and routines of our classroom and enjoy the play based exploration using a variety of toys, games and equipment. Some of our favourites include our kitchen, shop and workbench. We are excited to experience all the new events the first year of school has to offer and making new friends along the way.

This term in Room 14 we have been focusing on different character strengths linked to the Berry Street program, with the first couple weeks being based on 'kindness'.

As a class we talked about what kindness means to us, how to be kind to others, and the different ways we can set examples in being kind. The students have been participating in "The Kindness Project" where they have each made a kindness card with positive statements, and will soon be delivering these to the neighbouring streets letterboxes, as a means to spread kindness to others.

NAPLAN

Between the 14th and 24th March, our Years 3 and 5 students will be participating in the various NAPLAN assessments. Over the years, we have seen a number of students and parents get quite anxious about these assessments. We are writing to let you know, that whilst

it's understandable to be a little nervous, all we ask any of our students is to give it their best efforts. For the mums and dads at home, the best way that you can support your kids is to reassure them that that they just have to try their best, don't place unnecessary expectations or pressure about getting everything correct and please don't let it be the focus of that time frame. Children are made up of more than an assessment score, we all have our strengths and areas that we can improve. NAPLAN doesn't capture a sense of humour, social skills, or friendships. It does not focus on our school values; Respect, Responsibility and Honesty. Whilst NAPLAN is an important snap shot of students abilities in Literacy and Numeracy (and gives us as a school direction to strengthen if large numbers of students have not grasped a concept), the best advice we can offer, is just do your best.

School Interviews

In week 8 this term, we will be hosting Parent/Teacher interviews. This will be a perfect time to meet with your children's teachers and discuss how they have gone in the first term. More information and the online booking schedule will be sent out soon.
