Last week we had NAPLAN tests for our year 3s, and 5s. I have been really impressed with how well the students have managed and adapted. Overall there was a feeling of calm the children were basically very attentive to teacher and SSO requests and just let the process run naturally. Tests can be stressful for any of us, so I thank the teachers and SSO staff for making students feel comfortable as possible in fulfilling this task. There will be catch up tests this week for students that have been away.

Keep in mind that NAPLAN is only 1 form of testing and that a student's results and progress are based on a variety of tests, observations, moderation processes and teacher judgements.

I thank our Deputy Tegan Sims for the smooth operation of processes and supporting all staff and encouraging students.

Last week we also had a Pupil Free day. This particular day had a focus on School Culture. We are working with Matt Krieg from a company called Driven Within that supports schools, companies and businesses to examine their culture and performance.

Grievance Procedures:

Just a friendly reminder if you have a grievance to follow processes in the grievance Procedures Document. Should you have an issue that needs discussing. You will find this on page 10 of this newsletter.

If you have an issue at school that affects your child/ children -please make contact with the class teacher initially. If you wish to meet with myself or another member of Leadership or Student Support Services — please contact the front office to make an appointment for a phone call or face to face meeting.

Leadership staff are often committed to teaching or other meetings so will not always be available immediately- however we are more than happy to meet if you make a time.

There is a complaints number attached if you wish to contact the Department for Education if you believe your need further clarification or are not happy with processes that you have explored on site.

Governing Council:

Each school has a Governing Council made up of mainly parents and usually a community representative and some staff. The bulk of members need to be parents.

Governing Council allows members to have a say in what happens on site, a look at student progress data, support for fundraising and a look at the budget, policies, OSHC processes and the Site Improvement Plans. Your input is valuable and valued.

We really need some extra members to function as a legal group. Your school needs you!





JP SCIENCE

In R/1/2 Design and Technology, students have been exploring how animals and plants are grown and used for food, clothing and shelter to help our community. We have discussed the basic needs of animals and plants to help them grow healthy and strong. We are now learning about different types of materials that are appropriate for building animal shelters.









In year 2 Science we have been exploring a variety of materials to see if we can change them without actually changing the material itself. We have conducted experiments and made predictions. Together we recycled our scrap paper and turned it into new paper which we have examined with a magnifying glass and compared it with new paper.



If you have a grievance or concern, please follow the following steps:


