Please communicate any absences to the OSHC mobile via text. Unexplained absences will be charged the full session price. We require 24 hours for any cancellations during the term. Any cancellations not within 24 hours will still be charged for the session, unless a doctors certificate can be provided.

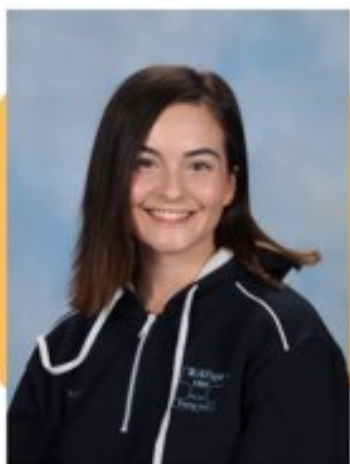


LAUREN - ASSISTANT DIRECTOR

LISA- QUALIFIED EDUCATOR

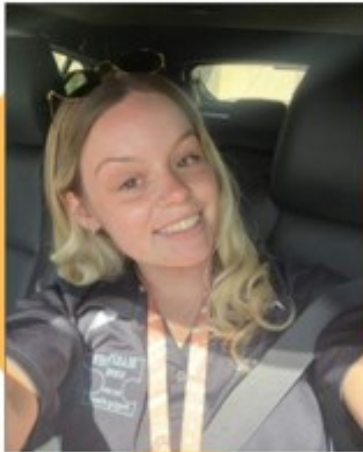

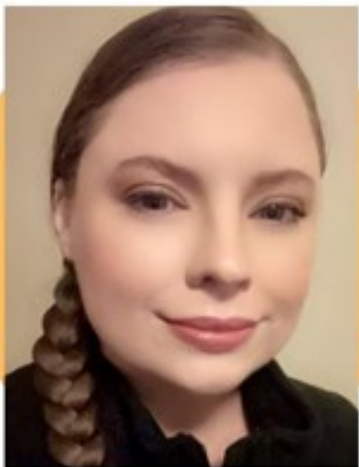


NEW STAFF ALERT

MY TIME, OUR PLACE OUTCOMES

OUTCOME 1: CHILDREN HAVE A STRONG SENSE OF IDENTITY

- 1.1 Children feel safe, secure and supported.
- 1.2 Children develop their autonomy, inter-dependence, resilience and sense of agency.
- 1.3 Children develop knowledgeable and confident self-identities.
- 1.4 Children learn to interact in relation to others with care, empathy and respect.

OUTCOME 2: CHILDREN ARE CONNECTED WITH AND CONTRIBUTE TO THEIR WORLD

- 2.1 Children develop a sense of belonging to groups and communities and an understanding of the reciprocal rights and responsibilities necessary for active community participation.
- 2.2 Children respond to diversity with respect.
- 2.3 Children become aware of fairness.
- 2.4 Children become socially responsible and show respect for the environment.

OUTCOME 3: CHILDREN HAVE A STRONG SENSE OF WELLBEING

- 3.1 Children become strong in their social and emotional wellbeing.
- 3.2 Children take increasing responsibility for their own health and physical wellbeing.

OUTCOME 4: CHILDREN ARE CONFIDENT AND INVOLVED LEARNERS

- 4.1 Children develop dispositions such as curiosity, cooperation, confidence, creativity, commitment, enthusiasm, persistence, imagination and reflexivity.
- 4.2 Children use a range of skills and processes such as problem solving, inquiry, experimentation, hypothesising, researching and investigating.
- 4.3 Children transfer and adapt what they have learned from one context to another.
- 4.4 Children resource their own learning through connecting with people, place, technologies and natural and processed materials.

OUTCOME 5: CHILDREN ARE EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATORS

- 5.1 Children interact verbally and non-verbally with others for a range of purposes.
- 5.2 Children engage with a range of texts and gain meaning from these texts.
- 5.3 Children collaborate with others, express ideas and make meaning using a range of media and communication technologies.

Hats @ OSHC

Starting Thursday Week 2, children will be required to wear a hat while playing outside at OSHC. In the past, we provided each child with their own hat and, due to limited space, asked that they keep these in their bag. However, many hats went missing. To address this, we will have a supply of OSHC hats available for all children to use should they not have one of their own. These hats will be sprayed daily and washed weekly. We understand there may be concerns about children sharing hats, so please feel free to keep a labelled hat in your child's bag for them to use at OSHC.

Please read below for information on appropriate hats.

HATS

According to Cancer Council Australia, sun-safe hats should:
protect a person's face, neck, and ears.

Suitable options include:

- A legionnaire hat: The front peak and flap should overlap at the sides, and the flap should cover the neck.
- A bucket hat with a deep crown and an angled brim that is at least 5 cm for young children.
- A broad-brimmed hat with a brim size of at least 6 cm for children. The brim should provide shade for the whole face.

Please note: Baseball caps and visors do not provide enough sun protection and are therefore not recommended.



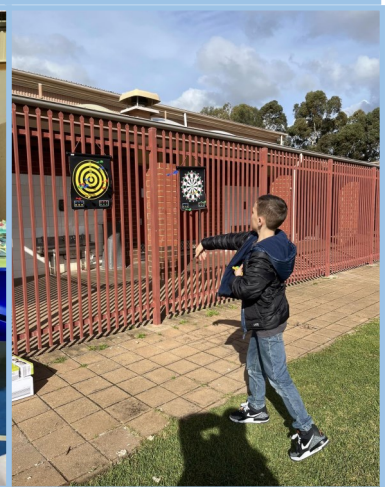
